BEHAVIOR

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 schooldays, and Student C will have read for 3.

WRITING

This year in third grade the focus is on writing more than one paragraph of topics.

This includes stretching out sentences and details. Our focus is also on going back and making our writing better. Students will learn and apply revising and editing strategies to their writing.

Our units of writing include:
Personal Narrative
Imaginative Narrative
Opinion Writing
Writing About Research

We also write in all other subjects.



WRITING

Words Their Way Word Study:

- Vocabulary and Spelling
- New words every other week
- Tests every other Friday
- Spelling contract at home will help students study for the test at home but we spend a lot of time in class working on word study too!
- Words Their Way: Focus is on understanding spelling patterns. This also helps your child become a better reader too!

READING

In third grade, our focus is to deepen our understanding about what we are reading. We will be going beyond basic questions about the text. Students will practice responding to a variety of texts and questions. This is preparation for state testing. Writing about what we are reading is a big concept in third grade. The strategy we will be using to respond to a text is called R.A.C.E.

READING



RESTATE THE QUESTION

Restate or reword the question and turn it into a statement.



ANSWER THE QUESTION

What is being asked? Answer all parts of the question.



CITE THE SOURCE

Tell where you found examples and details in the text. In paragraph 2... The text states ... The author says...



EXPLAIN your response. Give evidence from the text to support your answer. Add your thoughts.

For example... This shows... This means... I believe...





This is an exciting year in math! A lot of what students will be learning is very new to them!

Our emphasis this year will not only be computation but the ability to explain both verbally and in writing how they solved a math problem or know an answer.

SCIENCE


In science we will be using the PROBLEM based learning approach. This approach is when children are presented with a real world problem that affects their own life. They are then guided into research to help come up with a solution. Throughout the process we have people from the community come in to share information with the students as well. By the end, they are to come up with a solution to the problem. They will present their solution to a panel of real life professionals in the field that their problem resides.

PBL is a great opportunity for students to have real life, authentic learning. It also teaches them employability skills. Through the research, problem solving, and presenting to professionals, children gain skills they can use for a lifetime.
